SYSTEM SAFETY COURSES

SE 101 System Safety and Analysis for Engineers

32 Hours

Contract | \$10,000

Application of engineering and management principles, criteria, and techniques to optimize safety within the constraints of operational effectiveness, time, and cost throughout all phases of the life cycle of a system or facility. Accident prevention, beginning with systems engineering together with sound management, are combined in this course to enable the student to fully comprehend their vital roles in preventing accidents. The total system life-cycle process, from system design concepts, technology development, system development and demonstration, production and deployment, and operation support, through testing, maintenance/systems management and operational employment are fully examined and evaluated.

SE 201 Hazard & Accident Analysis Techniques for System Safety

32 Hours

Contract | \$10,000

This course introduces system safety engineering methods, emphasizing practical application. Topics include FMEA/FMECA, fault tree analysis, event tree analysis, hazard analysis, and probability models for risk prediction. Participants gain an understanding of hazard effects, engineering models, and mathematical tools to assess hazardous conditions. The course equips students to use safety engineering analysis for accident probability assessment.

SE 202 Fuze Safety and Ignition Systems

8 Hours

Contract | \$4,000

This course covers the Department of Defense (DoD) requirements for the safe design of fuzes, munition ignition systems, and associated ignition safety devices used to arm and fire munition and propulsion systems. Fuze and ignition safety standards are explained along with the safety review process to include the applicable regulations and artifacts required for approval.

SE 203 Insensitive Munitions

8 Hours

Contract | \$4,000

The course reviews the Insensitive Munitions Program and covers the current policy and guidance, the development process and the safety implications. A review of technology solutions and developments, preparation of a Threat Hazard Assessment, guidance on complying with the safety requirements for qualification and final type qualification, and guidance for complying with testing and analysis requirements to include evaluation of the results to assess a munition's compliance with Insensitive Munitions Program criteria.

SE 301 Advanced System Safety Engineering

32 Hours

Contract | \$10,500

This advanced course in system safety focuses on enhancing the skills and knowledge of safety engineers in managing U.S. Army acquisition system safety programs. Participants will learn to effectively identify and control hazards, quantify and manage risks, and oversee safety throughout the system's life cycle. The course revisits engineering and management principles, criteria, and techniques introduced in the SE 101 System Safety and Analysis for Engineers and SE 201 Hazard & Accident Analysis Techniques for Safety Engineers courses, with a deeper focus on their practical application. Key topics include tasks, program relationships, and interactions essential for a successful system safety program. Emphasis is on life-cycle safety management activities, from program initiation through operations, sustainment, and end-of-life, highlighting critical elements for achieving materiel release safety.

SE 302 Software System Safety

32 Hours

Contract | \$11,500

This course addresses the growing role of safety-critical software in complex systems. Participants gain essential skills for designing and evaluating such software to prevent accidents. The curriculum covers hazard identification, risk management, and applies these practices across the system's lifecycle. It offers tailored software safety requirements, tools, and techniques applicable to system safety engineers and project management personnel overseeing safety-critical designs. The course incorporates real-world case studies and lessons learned in system safety engineering.

SE 303 Facility System Safety

24 Hours

Contract | \$8,000

This course uses a system safety engineering approach to manage safety and occupational health of a facility during its life cycle by examining deficiencies in facility design/acquisition, facility modification, associated testing, and operational sequences, which can result in acceptance of risk. It provides information and guidance for the development of a facility safety program during the acquisition process and to ensure integration of safety within the facility acquisition process.

SE 304 Ammunition & Explosives Hazard Classification

16 Hours

Contract | \$7,500

This course covers the ammunition and explosives hazard classification procedures for transportation and storage by the Department of Defense Components. Participants will review the procedures for assessing the potential reaction of ammunition and explosives to specified phenomenon. Based on the reactions, you will be able to assign the Class and Hazard Division using the procedures in Technical Bulletin 700-2 for these items for transportation and storage.

SE 306 Hazards of Electromagnetic Radiation to Ordnance (HERO)

16 Hours

Contract | \$7,500

This course covers the potential risks and safety measures associated with electromagnetic radiation in ordnance environments. Participants will gain insight into the HERO principles and regulations providing them with the knowledge to mitigate potential hazards. This course will cover the principles, regulations, and risk mitigation strategies on electromagnetic radiation as it relates to ordnance. Participants will learn to identify electromagnetic radiation hazards, conduct risk assessments, and leverage technology to protect ordnance. The course provides insight into the international and national compliance standards to be able to select and implement best safety practices. Case studies will be used to provide a practical understanding of the hazards and safety measures for protecting ordnance in electromagnetic radiation environments.

SE 620 System Safety and Analysis

16-Hours

Contract | \$5,000

This course provides participants with a comprehensive view of system safety and how it is to be integrated into the life cycle of a system. Upon completion, participants will be able to interpret system safety definitions as they relate to system safety principles, demonstrate a working knowledge of the development system tasks, hazard analysis, and perform system analysis, identify hazards, and recommend appropriate control measures, demonstrate competence of system development through the life cycle phases and the impact of system safety, analyze the effects of the system safety process, and distinguish the effects of new technology on system safety.

11. Have Workers Dress for the Heat
12. Be prepared for an Emergency

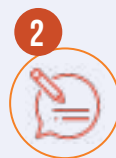
